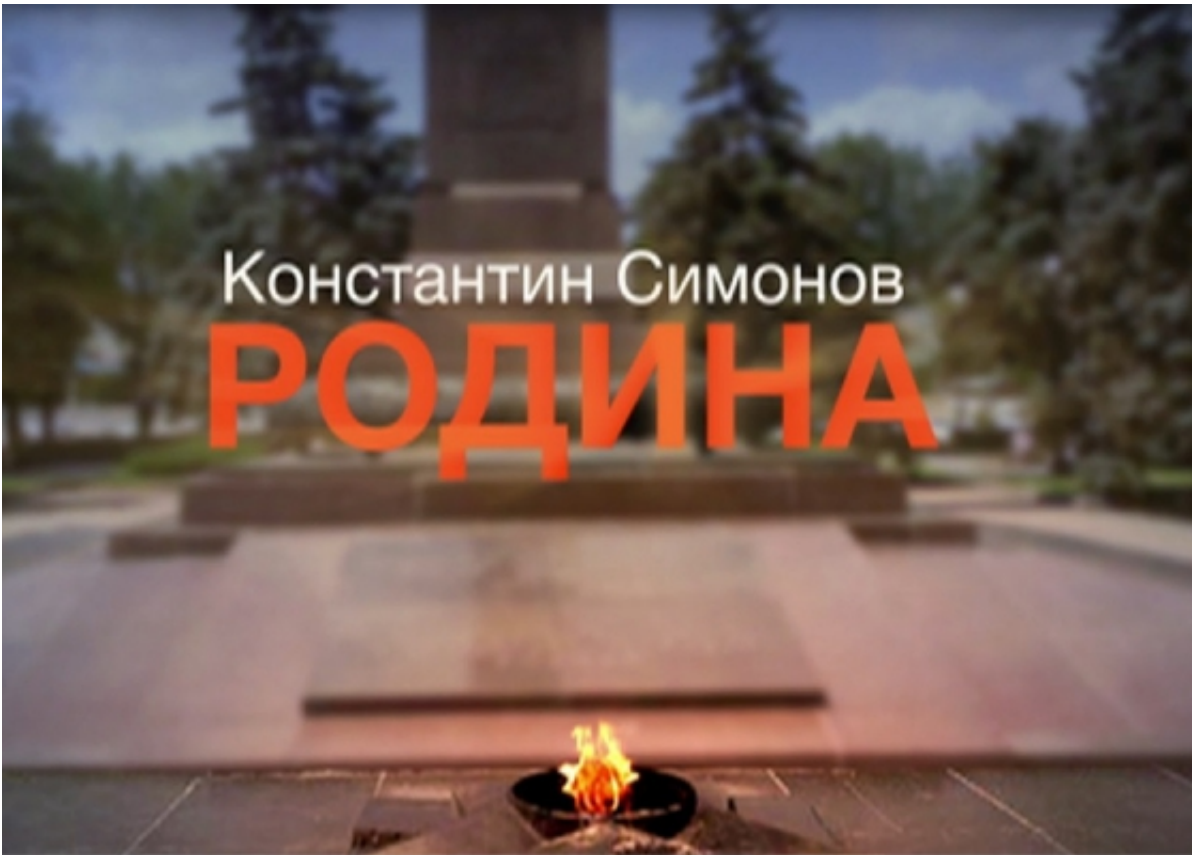

The Russia's I.C. employees read the poem "Motherland" in memory of heroes of the Great Patriotic War
