
Officers of the Russian Investigative Committee and Students of Departmental Educational Institutions donate humanitarian aid to Donbas, Kherson and Zaporozhye Oblasts



In Rostov Oblast the transfer of humanitarian cargo took place. It was collected by the Staff of the Investigative Committee of Russia, Students and Officers of Departmental Academies and Cadet Corps, as well as with the participation of wards and medical staff of the Hospital for War Veterans No. 2 of the Moscow Health Department.

All Officers of the Russian Investigative Committee rendered all possible assistance; no one was left aside, because it is our common goal to help the front in defeating the Nazi Kiev regime.
