In Stavropol Territory students of M. Yadrov cadet classes under auspices of Russian Investigative Committee took part in patriotic events dedicated to 69th anniversary of Victory

Sedrak Petrosovich Tumasyan is 83 years old, but he remains on duty and is willing to share his experience with young investigators and those who only dream of investigative work. At the end of the meeting, students of cadet classes presented gifts to the home front worker and congratulated him on the upcoming holiday.
